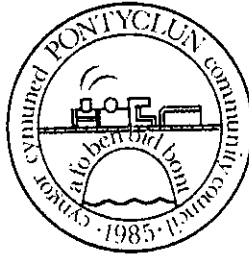

Minutes of the meeting of the Pontyclun Community Council held in the Pontyclun Community Centre, Pontyclun, at 8.00 p.m. on Wednesday, 4 September, 1996

PRESENT: Community Councillors Mr C G Bendle, Mrs A Cale,
Mr J G Davies, Mr T Flood, Mrs M M Griffiths,
Mr R G Norman (Chairperson) and Mr M Rea

ALSO IN ATTENDANCE: P C Steve Keddle (for part of the meeting) and two members of the public.

1. **Apologies**

Apologies for absence were received on behalf of Community Councillors T J Burton and R O Edwards.

2. **Chairperson's business**

(a) **Pontyclun Junior Football Club**

The Chairperson, Councillor Norman, reported that during the summer recess he had been invited to make presentations to the Under 9 s and Under 11 s football teams. He had been proud to represent the Community Council and had admired the enthusiasm and dedication displayed by the junior teams.

The matter was noted.

(b) **Llanharry Horticultural Show**

The Chairperson reported that during the summer recess he had been invited to make the presentations to winning entrants at the Llanharry Horticultural Show. The Chairman commented that the entries were of a very high standard.

The matter was noted.

(c) **Pontyclun Horticultural Show Society -
(Community Allotments Competition)**

The Chairperson reported that during the summer recess, judging, and the award of prizes, had taken place for the Pontyclun Horticultural Show Society. The Chairman handed the Clerk a list of prizewinners for the Community Council's records.

The matter was noted.

(d) **Local Plan**

The Chairperson referred to the further opportunity for objections to be made to the Local Plan and the authority which the Council had given the Clerk and himself at to make such objections at its meeting on 3 July, 1996.

On behalf of the Council a further objection had been submitted in relation to the proposed Mwndy Access Road. The objection had listed 6 important areas where further investigation needed to be carried out before any work started on the scheme.

The matter was noted.

3. **Police matters**

(I) **Survey**

P C Keddle referred to the survey which had been carried out by the former Mid Glamorgan County Council into highways matters in Pontyclun. He enquired whether the result of the survey had been received.

The Clerk responded that he understood from former County Council officers that the results of the survey were to form the basis of a report to a sub committee of the Highways Committee. Prior to the reorganisation of local government on 1 April, 1996, he had enquired of the County Council whether the results of the survey in Pontyclun had been placed before the sub committee. He was informed that the survey results had not been placed before the sub committee. It was unclear whether the survey results would be placed before a committee of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council but the Clerk would clarify the matter with the Director of Highways, Transportation and Engineering.

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(ii) **Submission of traffic reports**

In response to a question from the Council, PC Keddle confirmed that he regularly submitted reports on traffic matters which were discussed at Community Council meetings.

(iii) **Congregating of teenagers**

The Chairman, Councillor Norman, reported that he had received numerous complaints about the unruly behaviour of teenagers who now regularly gathered in the car park adjacent to the Pontyclun Community Centre.

It appeared that the teenagers persisted in playing loud music on their radios, swearing and being abusive to those who complained. Recently, there had been an incident where the eggs had been thrown against the doors of the Community Centre.

At this point the Clerk read out a letter which had been received from a resident of River's Edge, Pontyclun, who sought advice on what action might be taken to resolve the situation.

P C Keddle confirmed that the police had received complaints about the teenagers and that he had spoken to youths gathered in the car park. P C Keddle confirmed that the police's power to act in such circumstances was limited but he had sought to persuade the teenagers to be more thoughtful and give consideration to residents living nearby. It appeared that the teenagers congregated in the car park because they had nothing to do and they claimed that there were no other facilities in the village.

P C Keddle agreed that he would visit the resident in River's Edge and discuss the resident's concerns.

4. **Minutes of the Community Council's meeting of 3 July, 1996**

RESOLVED: That the minutes of the Council's meeting of 3 July, 1996 be approved as an accurate record.

5. **Matters arising**

(a) **Proposed sites for grit bins**

The Clerk received lists from Members of proposed sites for winter grit bins.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk forward the list to the Director of Highways, Transportation and Engineering of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council.

(b) **Casual vacancy in the Miskin Ward**

The Clerk advised the Council that since its last meeting the appropriate notices had been displayed drawing attention to the casual vacancy in the Miskin Ward. The Returning Officer had been requested to hold an election and it was understood that the election would take place on Thursday, 12 September, 1996.

The election would be held in All Hallows Church, Miskin, and it was understood that the count would take place at the same premises later in the evening.

The Clerk had requested the Rhondda Cynon Taff Borough Council to issue poll cards for the election.

The matter was noted.

(c) **RCT in Bloom Competition, 1996**

The Council was pleased to note that the Pontyclun War Memorial had won third prize in the RCT in Bloom Competition for 1996.

A formal presentation ceremony was planned for the Autumn and the Council had been asked to nominate its representative to attend the presentation.

RESOLVED: That the Chairman, Councillor R G Norman be nominated to attend the presentation on behalf of the Community Council.

(d) **Policy of the former Taff Ely Borough Council of supplying diaries to members of community councils**

The Clerk reported that he had made enquiries of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council to establish whether it was proposed to continue the practice of the former Taff Ely Borough Council of supplying municipal diaries to members of community councils.

He had established that the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council did not propose supplying municipal diaries to community councils.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk contact the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council again to ascertain whether it would be prepared to allow the Community Council to purchase supplies of municipal diaries.

(e) **Community Questionnaire**

The Clerk reported that the response to the Community Questionnaire had been encouraging and that, to date, 166 completed questionnaires had been returned to the Community Council from the central collection point in the Community Shop in Pontyclun.

In addition to completed questionnaires some residents had written letters to the Community Council. In most cases, the Clerk had been able to acknowledge receipt of the letters and it was planned to acknowledge receipt of the remainder in due course.

RESOLVED:

- (i) That Councillor Mrs Margaret Griffiths be requested to undertake preliminary work on the completed questionnaires to gain an overall view of the issues of concern to Community residents.
- (ii) That on completion of Councillor Griffiths' preliminary work a sub group be convened, comprising Councillors Bendle, Griffiths and Norman, together with the Clerk, to recommend a way of progressing issues to the Community Council.

- (iii) That a letter of thanks be sent to the Manageress of the Community Shop thanking her, and her assistants, for her for the help readily given in receiving the questionnaires on behalf of the Community Council.

6. **Minutes of the Community Council's meeting of 9 July, 1996**

RESOLVED: That the minutes of the Community Council's meeting of 9 July, 1996 be approved as an accurate record.

7. **Matters arising**

(a) **Proposals for twinning**

The Clerk advised the Council that since its last meeting he had not received any information about the rumoured proposals for a twinning arrangement for Pontyclun. He had been unable to pursue the matter any further.

Councillor Bendle commented that he, too, had heard nothing about the rumoured proposals although he continued to be approached by members of the public who wished to receive information on the proposals and asked why the Community Council was not involved.

Councillor Bendle reminded the Council that rumours about a meeting to discuss twinning proposals first came to the Council's attention on 9 July, 1996. Information he had subsequently received indicated that Councillor Burton had been present at that meeting despite, a week earlier, offering his apologies for his inability to attend a Council meeting on 9 July because of family problems. Councillor Bendle was of the view that the lack of communication from Councillor Burton had caused embarrassment to the Community Council.

RESOLVED: That the matter be noted.

(b) **Late applications for grant for 1996/97**

The Clerk advised the Council that if it wished to exclude members of the press and the public for this item of business it would be necessary to give formal notice in advance of the meeting. In that event, the consideration of grants to late

applicants would need to be deferred to the Council's next meeting. Alternatively, the Council could consider the award of grants to late applicants without the exclusion of the press and public.

At this point members of the public volunteered to leave the meeting. No members of the press were in attendance.

RESOLVED: That the following additional grants be made for 1996/97:

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Notes

In awarding the above grants the Council took into account the advice given by the District Auditor on the changes made to Section 137 of the Local Government Act, 1972, by Sections 36 to 38 of the Local Government and Housing Act, 1989. In particular, whether:

- (a) The payments were of direct benefit
- (b) The benefits were in proportion to the payment made
- (c) The organisation's own resources were sufficient and other potential income considered including other local councils' and
- (d) The money was not being used to circumvent any limitations on specific powers
- (e) The impact of grants and of setting a precedent which would result in applications from other groups.

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8. **Proposals of the Bro Taf Health Authority for amendment of the Taff Ely Local Plan in respect of Talygarn Rehabilitation Centre**

Councillor Mrs Margaret Griffiths explained that Mr Derek Kingham, the former Administrator at the Talygarn Rehabilitation Centre, had recently been advised of an application by the Bro Taf Health Authority to amend the Taff Ely Local Plan in so far as it related to the Talygarn Rehabilitation Centre.

The Bro Taf Health Authority stated that the Centre was due to close in 1999 and at that time it would be declared surplus to requirements. There would be an obligation on the Health Authority to dispose of the site.

It was clear that as a result of a number of planning restraints on the site, it would not be open to the Health Authority to realise the site to its full commercial potential. As a consequence, the Health Authority sought to amend the Local Plan. The planning brief produced by the Health Authority's planning consultants was considered to be verging on dishonest in that it considerably played down the role of the existing facilities on site.

Councillor Griffiths advised the Council that there was strong local feeling against the Health Authority's plans and that residents believed that the house and its surroundings should be kept for public use and enjoyment rather than commercial development. Councillor Griffiths reminded the Council that there were many examples in South Wales where important sites had been bought by local authorities and safeguarded for the public.

Preliminary indications were that the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council would be consulting the public on the Health Authority's proposals during November. However, if effective opposition to the Health Authority's plans were to be launched it was important to begin work immediately.

- RESOLVED:**
- (a) That the Clerk contact the Chief Executive's Office of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council:
 - (i) drawing attention to the plans of the Bro Taf Health Authority and
 - (ii) requesting that the Borough Council give earnest consideration to the purchase of the site for public use and enjoyment in recognition of the historical importance of Talygarn House, its gardens, and the very strong links between Talygarn and the mining communities of South Wales.

- (b) That the Community Council make provisional plans to raise public awareness of the Health Authority's intentions for Talygarn Rehabilitation Centre including holding public meetings and enlisting the support of influential bodies to prevent commercial exploitation of the site.

9. **Creation of cycle ways in the Community**

Councillor Mrs Margaret Griffiths again raised the possibility of creating cycle paths in the Community which would provide a safe environment for a significant number of residents who would be able to access local shops and schools without having to run the gauntlet of ever increasing traffic on local roads. Councillor Griffiths pointed out that, nationally, a large number of cycle paths were being created some of which had attracted funding from the National Lottery.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk obtain information from Sustrans, a body promoting the creation of cycle paths, for further information.

10. **Request to implement traffic speed reduction schemes in Pontyclun**

Several Members expressed their frustration at the ever increasing volume of traffic passing through Pontyclun, and the tendency for more and more drivers to speed through the village. Despite the highway authority being fully aware of the problems, and many promises of action having been given, very few measures had been introduced to reduce the speed of traffic travelling through Pontyclun.

Members pointed to the recently erected prominent signs in Llanharan instructing motorists to observe the speed restriction in the village. Similar traffic calming measures were desperately needed in Pontyclun. The funding problem being experienced by the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council were understood and the Community Council believed that it may be in a position to make a financial contribution to traffic calming measures.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk write to the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council asking what traffic calming measures, if any, were proposed for Pontyclun, the date of their likely implementation, and whether, in principle, it would be possible for the Community Council to make a contribution towards the cost of implementing traffic calming measures.

11. **Roadworks in the vicinity of Pontyclun Railway Station**

The Council discussed a letter from the Director of Highways, Transportation and Engineering attaching a copy of a letter he had sent to Mr L H Bailey of 4 Station Terrace, Pontyclun, about the delay in the completion of works connected with the construction of the westbound platform of Pontyclun Station.

The delay due to the unforeseen need to make a compulsory purchase order. The delay had meant that the scheme was not completed during the lifetime of the Mid Glamorgan County Council. Completion of the scheme now fell to the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council. Due to financial constraints it was not possible to say when the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council would be able to complete the outstanding works.

RESOLVED: That the letter be noted.

12. **Proposed Liaison Committee for Forest Wood Quarry, Pontyclun**

The Council discussed the letter of 12 July, 1996, from the Director of Planning for the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council, in which he agreed in principle to the benefits which could result from the establishment of local liaison committees to promote good relationships between quarry operators and local residents. However, the Director of Planning was conscious of the potential resource implication for his department and was anxious that private liaison committees, such as the one proposed, were serviced locally. He also thought it unlikely that a member of his staff would be in a position to attend every meeting of the proposed liaison committee.

The Director of Planning stated that he would arrange for the quarry operator to be contacted seeking its views on the establishment of a liaison committee. In the meantime it was suggested that the Pontyclun Community Council ought to liaise with the Llanharry Community Council since that Council had also expressed an interest in becoming involved in a liaison committee.

- RESOLVED:** (i) That the Clerk liaise with the Clerk to the Llanharry Community Council about the creation of a liaison committee.
- (ii) That, provisionally, Councillor R G Norman be nominated to sit on the committee, together with Mrs O Bufton a resident of Talygarn
- (iii) That the Clerk contact Mrs Bufton about her willingness to sit on the proposed liaison committee.

- (iv) That the Council await the outcome of the Director of Planning's discussions with the operator of the Forest Wood Quarry.

13. **Wales Association of Community and Town Councils - East Glamorgan and Gwent Area**

The Council received details of a training course to be held in Cwmbran on the morning of Saturday, 7 September, 1996, on the New Audit and Accounts Regulations.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk be nominated to attend the course.

14. **Miskin Residents' Association**

The Council received a letter from Dr. A W Roberts, Chairman of the Miskin Residents' Association in which Dr ~~Davies~~^{Roberts} advised the Community Council about the re-establishment of the Association.

^{Roberts} Dr ~~Davies~~^{Roberts} further advised that the aim of the Association is to keep under review and to respond to present and future developments which may affect, either positively, or adversely, the residents of Miskin, both individually and collectively.

^{Roberts} Dr ~~Davies~~^{Roberts} informed the Council that the Association would be taking an interest in current issues which affect Miskin residents particularly the construction of new roads, blasting at Hendy Quarry, the monitoring of methane gas emission, further proposals for residential development and the effect of the new Cefn yr Hendy development. The Association intended to publish a newsletter to keep residents aware of its activities.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk write to Dr ~~Davies~~^{Roberts} welcoming the re-establishment of the Association and providing him the names and addresses of the Directors of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council his association would need to contact in following up local issues.

15. **Electricity Consumers' Committee for South Wales - Newsletter for Summer/Autumn, 1996 - Issue No. 9**

The Council received Issue No 9, covering Summer/Autumn, 1996, from the South Wales Consumers' Committee for South Wales.

RESOLVED: That the newsletter be noted.

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16. **Licensing - Applications for a Protection Order and Transfer Order for the Miskin Manor Hotel**

RESOLVED: That the applications be noted.

17. **Application for financial assistance**

The Council discussed an application for financial assistance from Diabetes Concern, a charity caring for diabetics in South Wales.

(Note: Councillors Bendle and Cale declared an interest in the applications and took no part in the Community Council's deliberations)

RESOLVED: That the Council award a grant of £75.00.

18. **Planning applications contained in Weekly Notifications for Weeks ending 12 and 26 July and 2 August, 1996**

(a) **Application No 96/2227/10**

RESOLVED: That the application be opposed on the following grounds:

- (i) The proposed access and egress to the site is inadequate.
- (ii) The development would generate a considerable number of vehicle movements in Cowbridge Road at the point where a large number of children access the nearby comprehensive school.
- (iii) The proposed development site suffers considerably from the emission of industrial fumes from the nearby Purolite factory and development would undoubtedly result in complaints from prospective residents of the site.

(b) **Application No. 96/2224/10**

The Council discussed the above application and was of the view that as the work referred to in the application had already been carried out it was likely that the application for planning consent was being made in retrospect.

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RESOLVED: That the Clerk establish from the Director of Planning whether the application was a retrospective application.

19. **Payment of creditors**

RESOLVED: That payment be approved to the creditors listed in Appendix 17 to the Council's agenda.

20. **Reports from Members**

(a) **Condition of road and lane to the rear of the Brunel Arms, Pontyclun**

Councillor Bendle reported on the unkempt condition of the road and lane to the rear of the Brunel Arms, Pontyclun. He pointed out that the highways were frequently strewn with glass and bottle tops and other litter which was believed to have originated from the Brunel Arms.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk report the condition of the highways to the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council with a request that receptacles be provided for litter in the area.

(b) **The Mill, Brynsadler**

Councillor Mrs Griffiths drew the Council's attention to a concrete block wall which appeared to have been erected on top of an existing stone wall at a barn at The Mill in Cowbridge Road, Brynsadler.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk ascertain from the Planning Department of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council whether planning permission was required for the work.

(c) **Land at the end of School Street, Pontyclun**

Councillor Flood advised the Council that a plot of land at the end of School Street, Pontyclun, which was originally understood to be in the ownership of the former Taff Ely Borough Council, and subsequently in the ownership of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council, had been built upon. Enquiries of the former Borough Council had revealed that the land had not been sold.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk ascertain whether the land had been sold and, if so, whether planning permission had been awarded for the development now taking place.

(d) **Pontyclun Railway Station**

Councillor Flood pointed out that no action had been taken by Railtrack to make the east bound pedestrian approach to Pontyclun Station safer. Councillor Flood drew the Council's attention to the practice of a number of children of skateboarding in the vicinity to the approach. In the absence of gates there was a very real of a child being injured.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk again contact Railtrack with a view to the erection of gates at the top of the pedestrian approach.

(e) **Main line railway in Pontyclun**

Councillor Flood reported that during the summer months horses had been found to be running along the railway line in Pontyclun. Clearly, there was a very real risk of a serious accident occurring involving trains and passengers.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk advise Railtrack of the incident in order that any broken fences in the vicinity of Pontyclun might be repaired.

(f) **Fence near bordering railway property**

Councillor Davies reported that a section of fence, bordering railway property and adjacent to Pontyclun Post Office, had become defective and strands of wire were projecting at eye level. A child had recently had an accident at the spot.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk report the matter to Railtrack as a matter of urgency.

(g) **Community Noticeboard**

Councillor Davies drew the Council's attention to the disused postage stamp dispenser outside the Pontyclun Post Office and advised that the owner of the premises would be prepared for a Community Council noticeboard to be erected at the spot. The

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Clerk confirmed that he had already sought guidance from the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council on whether planning consent was necessary and was awaiting a decision.

RESOLVED: That in the event that planning consent was necessary, the Clerk make the appropriate application.

(h) **Derelict house, Cowbridge Road, Brynsadler**

Councillor Mrs Cale advised the Council about the very dilapidated condition of No. 13 Cowbridge Road, Brynsadler. Many complaints had been about the condition of the house and Councillor Cale asked whether there was any action the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council could take to get the owner to repair the premises.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk pursue the matter with the Environmental Services Department of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council.

(I) **30 m.p.h. speed restriction in Groesfaen**

Councillor Rea expressed his frustration that no work had yet been carried out to move the 30 m.p.h. speed restriction sign at the western end of the village to an agreed site nearer in the direction of the Castell y Mynach Inn.

Councillor Rea reminded the Council that agreement in principle to move the sign had been forthcoming from the former Mid Glamorgan County Council many months before the reorganisation of local government. Councillor Rea failed to understand how such a simple matter could take so long.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk take the matter up again with the Director of Highways, Transportation and Engineering for the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council and that in the event of a negative answer, or no answer being received, then the Clerk write direct to the Chairperson of the Highways Committee.

(j) **Brofiskin Quarry, Groesfaen**

Councillor Rea reminded the Council that the disused Brofiskin Quarry in Groesfaen had been the subject of a number of

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planning applications in recent years in connection with car trading. All the applications had been refused by the local planning authority.

Councillor Rea advised that despite the refusal of planning consent, trading in cars was still taking place from the disused quarry. As recently as the last weekend he had personally seen a loaded car transporter making a delivery to the quarry. Councillor Rea estimated that he had also received around 25 complaints from residents about the use of the former quarry.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk pursue the matter with the Director of Planning of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council.

(k) **Mains sewerage, Groesfaen**

Councillor Rea sought clarification on the legal position regarding the connection of properties in Groesfaen to the mains sewerage system. He had sought clarification from the Planning Department of the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council and Welsh Water but had received conflicting information and was uncertain of the position.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk contact Welsh Water and the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council to ascertain the position and to establish if there were any plans to regularise the position of those properties in Groesfaen who were presently without mains sewerage.

21. **Any other business of an urgent nature**

(a) **Allotments' perimeter fence**

Councillor Norman reported that new perimeter fencing had recently been erected around the allotments adjacent to Clun Avenue, Pontyclun. Within a fortnight of the work being carried out a car had careered into a section of the new fence causing it to be damaged. Work had since been carried out to repair the damage.

The matter was noted.

(b) **Reinstatement of grass verges and hedges**

Councillor Norman referred to recent works adjacent to the highway in

Pontyclun and Miskin. In the former case the grass verge had been very poorly reinstated, while in the latter, very little effort had been made to reinstate the hedgerow.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk contact the respective contractors to request that ~~the~~^a better standard of reinstatement be carried out in both cases.

(c) **The Millenium Fund**

The Clerk distributed information to Members on the availability of lottery monies from the Millenium Fund and details of the procedures which needed to be followed in making application for grant.

The information was noted.

(d) **"Crossroads"**

The Clerk distributed the information requested by the Council at its last meeting on the organisation "Crossroads" an organisation established to care for the carers in society. The organisation had recently opened an office in Pontyclun.

The information was noted.

(e) **Hendy Quarry Liaison Committee**

The Clerk advised the Council that prior to the meeting he had spoken to Councillor Burton. Councillor Burton had asked the Clerk to let the Council know that he had attended the Annual Meeting of the Hendy Quarry Liaison Committee in August and it was proposed that in future there would be places for two Miskin residents on the Liaison Committee.

The information was noted.

(f) **Remembrance Day, 1996**

The Clerk informed the Council that, as in previous years, he had ordered two poppy wreaths for the Remembrance Day services in November. It had been the practice of the Community Council to place a wreath on the war memorials in Miskin and Pontyclun.

RESOLVED: That the actions of the Clerk be confirmed.

(g) **Recognition of exceptional work**

Several Members commented favourably on the exceptional volume of work undertaken by the Community Council's Handyman and assistant during the summer months.

RESOLVED: That in the exceptional circumstances the Handyman and assistant be granted 1 extra day's leave in addition to normal leave entitlement.

(h) **Footpath from Miskin Square to The Drive**

The Council expressed its satisfaction with the recent work undertaken on the footpath from Miskin Square to the Drive which would allow residents to use the footpath in all weather. Members felt that a large measure of the credit for the work was due to the late Councillor Gordon Moir and wondered whether a suitable location could be found, in the vicinity of the footpath, to erect a plaque recording the late Councillor Moir's efforts.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk investigate a suitable site for the erection of a plaque.

(I) **Public Rights of Way**

Councillor Rea drew the Council's attention to the relatively poor quality of the black and white maps which had been provided to Members showing public rights of way in the Community. Councillor Rea asked if it would be possible to obtain coloured ordnance survey maps where the detail of public rights of way would be clearer.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk pursue the matter with the Highway Authority.
