Minutes of the meeting of the Pontyclun Community Council held at the Pontyclun Community Centre, Pontyclun, at 7.00 pm on Wednesday, 12 June, 2002.

2. <u>Declarations of interest</u>

3. <u>Chairperson's/Leader's business</u>

The Chairperson, Councillor Rea, reported that he, together with Chairs of other community councils in the Borough, had been invited to be present at the following day's visit of the Queen to mark the Jubilee celebrations.

The Leader, Councillor Huish, reported that he, too, had received an invitation to be present at the Queen's visit. He was proud to have been asked to make a presentation to the Queen. In his speech, Councillor Huish intended to refer to the fact that the Queen's grandfather visited Rhondda 70 years ago, almost to the day.

Councillor Huish also reported that the Annual Meeting of the Borough Council had been held on 30 May, 2002. Councillor Huish advised that Cabinet members at Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council had been given delegated powers in certain areas and he was confident that these new responsibilities would assist in providing a better level of service to residents of the Borough. Additionally, Councillor Huish was able to report that Councillor Islwyn Wilkins, of Llantrisant, had been elected Chairman of the Borough Council for the 2002/2003 municipal year.

Councillor Huish also advised that the Borough Council had approved of £35,000 for capital expenditure at Pontyclun Primary School in the course of the financial year.

RESOLVED:

That the Clerk send Councillor Wilkins its warmest congratulations on being elected Chairman of the Borough Council.

4. Police matters

P C Keddle reported that while, technically, he was still on annual leave from the police until Friday, 14 June, 2002, he was happy to attend the meeting and discuss matters concerning Members.

Several Members raised the subject of the proposed CCTV system in Pontyclun. They asked when the system was likely to be operational.

P C Keddle stated that he was unsure when the cameras were likely to be operational. He believed that the original date for the system to be operational was late Spring. However, he was aware that certain vision problems had been encountered after the columns had been erected and contractors needed to make adjustments.

Councillor Huish reported that, in conjunction with speed restriction works which were taking place in Heol Miskin, a "build out" was likely to be constructed at the junction of Heol Miskin and Llantrisant Road. Officers were examining the possibility of erecting a camera column in the "build out". It was forecast that the system would be fully operational by the end of August.

Work at Ivor Woods, Brynsadler

Members discussed the unsatisfactory width of the entrance to the footpath from Cowbridge Road, Brynsadler, to the Ivor Woods.

While the lack of width could be overcome by using the entrance to the adjacent garage during the day, Members were concerned that when the garage was closed, access to the footpath could only be gained by pedestrians and not but not by disabled people in wheelchairs.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk contact the Pontyclun Football Club with

a view to convening another meeting to explore what alternatives could be pursued in making the footpath

accessible by disabled people in wheelchairs.

9. Matters reported for information

(a) Former bus shelter in Cowbridge Road, Brynsadler

The Clerk referred to the Community Council bus shelter in Cowbridge Road, Brynsadler, which had been demolished in order to facilitate access to the new residential development at the site of the former Crown Brewery in Brynsadler.

The Clerk reminded the Council that the development company had given an undertaking to re-erect the bus shelter after the development was completed.

The Clerk advised that since building work began the highway authority had installed traffic lights very close to the site of the former bus shelter. The result of this was that it was no longer possible to re-erect the bus shelter at its former location in Cowbridge Road. The development company would honour its



commitment to re-erect the bus shelter but a new site needed to be found.

RESOLVED: That Members identify sites in their wards as

suitable locations for the erection of the bus shelter and report back to the next meeting of

the Community Council.

(b) Rhondda Cynon Taff Waste Forum Council

The Council was advised that vacancies for community representatives existed on the Rhondda Cynon Taff Waste Forum Council.
