## 4. Proposal to provide an Internet connection for Pontyclun Library

The Committee discussed a proposal to assist in the provision of an Internet facility at the Pontyclun Library.

Members felt that there would be wide benefit to residents of the Community in such a facility and it was extremely unlikely that the Rhondda Cynon Taff County Borough Council would be able to fund the proposal in the current economic climate.

**RECOMMENDED:** That the Community Council agree to fund a minimum of 25%, to a maximum of 50%, of the cost of the installation, with the balance being met by contributions from local businesses and residents.
