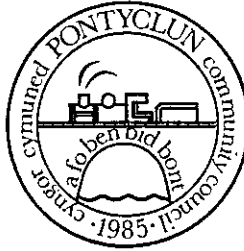

- (a) Proposed development at Brofiscin Park, Groesfaen

Councillor Norman reported that the application for planning permission by Llanmor Developments to develop land at Brofiscin Park, Groesfaen, had been refused by the Borough Council.

- (b) Change of use of premises,
Llantrisant Road, Pontyclun.

Councillor Norman reported that a planning application for a change of use of premises at No 4 Llantrisant Road, Pontyclun, from domestic use to commercial use had been approved by the Borough Council. The Community Council had earlier objected to the change.

- (c) Proposed industrial units
near the former Pontyclun Joinery

Councillor Norman reported that the planning application for the erection of industrial units near the former Pontyclun Joinery had been deferred by the Borough Council pending a report on safety aspects of the bailey bridge crossing the river Ely.

(b) Pollution of the River Clun

Councillor Mr T J Burton expressed deep concern at the white substance which he had seen floating on the river Clun. The substance had been carried into the river Ely and it was important that assurances be received that the material was not injurious to health, especially in view of the proximity of Y Pant Comprehensive School.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk take the matter up with the Chief Environmental Health Officer of the Borough Council, and that a copy of the letter be sent to the Chief Planning Officer of the Borough Council, referring to the current application for planning consent to bury chemicals near the river Clun.
