

Minutes of the special meeting of the Pontyclun Community Council held in the Pontyclun Community Centre, Pontyclun, at 5.00 p.m. on Wednesday, 21 October, 1992.

PRESENT: Community Councillors Mrs A Burton, Mr T J Burton, (Chairman), Mr J R Dilworth, Mr V P James, Mr R G Norman and Mrs O P Phillips

ALSO IN ATTENDANCE: Mrs Janet Davies, Leader of the Coalition on the Taff Ely Borough Council, and Mr Dennis Gethin Chief Executive and Clerk of the Taff Ely Borough Council.

1. Apologies for absence

Apologies for absence were received on behalf of Community Councillors Mr C G Bendle, Professor I D Bowen, Mr E V Griffith and Mr G M Moir

2. Proposals for the reorganisation of local government

Mrs Janet Davies and Mr Dennis Gethin addressed the Council about the government's proposals for the reorganisation of local government in Wales and in particular how those proposals affected the Borough of Taff Ely.

The proposals had always envisaged that shadow unitary authorities would be in place by 1 April, 1994, with unitary authorities assuming their full responsibilities on 1 April, 1995. It appeared that the County Councils would not form a basis for the unitary authorities but instead an expanded role was foreseen for a smaller number of district councils. It was not clear how many unitary authorities there would be in Wales but it was predicted that the eventual number would be between 23 and 27.

Taff Ely's position was far from clear. In some of the Secretary of State's earlier proposals Taff Ely was proposed as an unitary authority. In a later proposal the Borough was merged with the Borough of Rhondda. The latter proposal had generated fierce opposition as Taff Ely was seen as a young, expanding area with strong attractions to industrialists. Amalgamation with the Borough of Rhondda was seen to lessen the attractions of Taff Ely and present practical difficulties in the administration of services.

Mrs Davies and Mr Gethin believed that the Taff Ely Borough Council and the residents of Taff Ely had mounted an effective campaign to influence the Secretary of State's thinking. It was understood that over 12,000 residents had written to the Secretary of State expressing the wish for Taff Ely to become an unitary authority in its own right. Optimism was high that the amalgamation proposals would be dropped.

Mrs Davies and Mr Gethin also spoke of the role of community councils in a reorganised system. The Secretary of State's Consultation Document of June, 1991, had talked about enhancing the roles of community and town councils. The subsequent Green Paper had proved to be extremely disappointing with little or no enhanced roles proposed. From the Taff Ely perspective it would be essential to review existing agency arrangements with community councils in an unitary system.

The way forward would become clear with the publication of a White Paper by the government. It was predicted that the White Paper would be published on 16 November, 1992.

Mrs Davies and Mr Gethin responded to a number of questions on reorganisation from the Community Council. They thanked the Council for allowing them the opportunity to address and update Members on the current situation.

3. Financial grants - 1992/93
